Welcome Back

Dear Parents and Guardians,

On behalf of all the staff I would like to wish you and your child a warm welcome back as we begin a new school year. A special welcome to our 48 new Junior Infants and the new students who have joined us in different classrooms across the school. There are currently 490 children enrolled in our school. We look forward to the year ahead. Let us hope it is a good one for us all.

We had our beginning of school year mass celebration with Fr. Paul in the Parish church on Wednesday 25th September. Thank you to Fr. Paul for celebrating mass with us.

We had a busy summer and start to the school year in Scoil Bhríde. The Department has sanctioned the opening of a 2nd Autism class in our school. While the Board of Management had applied for a proper two classroom AS class facility similar to the boys school, the Department said there was no funding for this. They committed to works to convert an existing classroom. These works were due to start over the summer and the classroom was meant to be ready for the opening of the new school year. Works however, only began on Monday 23rd September and will take 6-8 weeks. We hope the class will be ready in November. We have three children in our school already enrolled in this class and Ms. Young will be the class teacher. This will be a junior Autism class.

The Department won't cover the cost of extending the soft play area for the children. We got a quote today for €18,000 to do this work. If anyone knows a business in Clane that might be able to donate towards this, it would be really appreciated.

We are delighted to support our Parents Association as we promote the 'Go Phone Free Initiative' in our school. Work has begun on the development of our new website and preparations are underway for our school musical 'Matilda'. Busy times.

It is hard to believe that the first month has already passed since we returned to school. We hope the children are now all settled back and happy in their school routine. We look forward to working with you all in the year ahead.

Enrolment for Junior Infants 2025/26 School Year Enrolment for our Junior Infant class and our AS classes will begin on the 25th October and end on the 15th November 2025. Applications can be submitted online. A birth certificate and a utility bill dated within the last 3 months are required as proof of address. These will need to be uploaded when the application is submitted. Please note the earlier time of enrolment this year. This was recommended by the Department of Education. Our Admissions notice will be posted on our website on the 18th October. **Hoop Earrings** A reminder that children are not allowed to wear Hoop earrings to school as it is a Health and Safety issue. Children who are wearing hoop earrings will be asked to remove them. Only one pair of stud earrings is allowed as per our Code of conduct. Erasmus
